The Board of Management organised a day for the retirees incorporating a mass and a banquet in the school hall. Best wishes to Ita, Winnie and their respective families for the, hopefully many years ahead.

Personally, I was delighted to be appointed as principal of my local school in June. This is my third phase involvement with the school; first as pupil, second as teacher and third as principal. I am happy to continue the family tradition with the school, starting with my late grandmother, Madge. I am happy to be following in the line of Sean Nyhan, George Barry, Catherine O' Brien and Ita O' Brien. Thanks to Ita and Winnie for their help during the transition process and indeed their continuing assistance to Catherine and myself.

Glad to report our numbers are on the rise. We welcomed 36 pupils to our school including 33 infants, while only saying goodbye to 21, who have gone to their chosen secondary school. The school now has an enrolment of 197 with an administrative Principal, 7 mainstream teachers, 2 full time Special Education Teachers, 1 visiting SEN teacher, 2 Special Needs Assistant, 1 Secretary and a caretaker. The boys reached the 7-a-side finals also but ended up losing to Tallow after extra time. Now we turn our attention to hurling and the competition which will start after Christmas. I'd like to pay special tribute to all staff who have worked very hard since the summer to get to terms with a new administration. The work load is all encompassing and becoming greater by the year. I'd like to thank them for all the additional activities they become involved in with the pupils, the school, throughout the Community and beyond. In addition most Tuesday evenings after school are spent formulating policies or attending staff meetings in compliance with the Croke Park directive.

End of Year & Start of Year Mass:

Fr Desmond officiated at our start of year mass in early October. The children played a major part in proceedings as did our school band. This was also to mark World Prayer Day for Children. Congrats to all those partaking in the monthly Children's mass in

the Nire and the Seasonal family mass alternating between Newcastle & Four Mile Water.

Sacrament of Confirmation:

Pupils from fifth and sixth class made their confirmation in Newcastle (30) and Touraneena (10) churches on 6th and 8th March respectively. Fr. Michael Cullinan deputised for Very Rev. William Lee, Bishop of Waterford & Lismore. Thanks to Mrs Byrne and Mrs. Coffey for preparing the candidates.

Sacrament of the Eucharist:

On Sat. 19th May, eighteen pupils from 2nd class made their First Holy Communion at St. Laurence's Church FMW. The following day a further seven pupils from the Nire received the sacrament at St. Bridget's Church the Nire. Thanks to Miss Fenton for preparing the class. Sincere thanks to Fr. Desmond & Fr. Active week took place in mid May 2012, which incorporated our non competitive School Sports Day, Active Week is held annually to maintain our well earned Blue Flag Status. Once again parents gave of their time to assist us in an inclusive varied programme of events. Our Wiii Dance Day was coordinated by E Muhlwald, also finding time to demonstrate Smoothie Making, using pedal power - a healthy "fruitful" activity. Once again Michael Desmond led a nature Walk up Curragheenavoher and imparted his abundant knowledge to all in sundry. Relaxation was the order of the day, when D Proctor visited and showed us all how to relax using gentle movement to classical Music. The highlight of the week proved to be the free standing "Climbing Wall", which stood at a daunting 28 ft. Children, teachers and parents scaled the structure to get a bird's eye view of the school.

Coaches:

Sport forms an integral part in the life of this community and this is replicated in our school. We are very fortunate to have a team of coaches come to the school to help our children with sport. We also have students from Colaiste Cathal Naofa, who travel to the school on a weekly basis and involve the pupils in a plethora of sports. After completing the soccer coaching, we now move to volleyball until Christmas. We thank all of these whose presence adds greatly to the atmosphere of our school. Rang 1-6 also partake in swimming lessons at Clonmel pool on Fridays.

Summer Works:

During the summer holidays a new toilet was built off the school Hall. This caters for those with special needs and was financed by the Dept of Education & Skills. It is an excellent addition to the school. Thanks to all concerned in the process from initiation to realisation.

New flooring has been laid in the main reception area, the toilets and the junior infant class. Thanks to Ita and her initiative in winning a competition, to get a classroom fitted out with this Marmoleum. Thanks also to a most generous benefactor who gave us an invaluable donation that enabled us to lay a new entrance hall floor. It really brightens up the atmosphere of the school and is conducive to cleaning and good hygiene practice. Thanks also to the Board for the extension of this, to all toilets within the school. Noel Hogan and Forbo ltd were a treat to deal with and it would be the wish of this school to roll this out to all classrooms in the medium term. Again thanks to all concerned.

It is my opinion that a lot of work needs to be carried out in the school. Windows are very dated and not conducive to heat retention. Insulation is also an issue during the winter. The pipe system is also antiquated and needs attention. To this end the BOM will be developing a programme of work to redress this. One or two fundraising ideas are floating around. I would also hope to establish a School Community Day in spring where all the relevant pillars can unite, perhaps on a voluntary basis and give the school and its environs a facelift. Your support would be greatly appreciated - as our motto denotes "Ní neart go cur le chéile" There's strength in unity. We will also lend our support to the local Spring Clean, this will be in furtherance to our ethos as a "Green Flag school" We will endeavour to attain the Energy Flag this year and a committee of all stakeholders within the school will derive ways of lowering our energy costs and reducing our carbon footprint.

On a safety note, we work adjacent to a very busy road and have over 200 people travelling to the school daily. I would kindly ask motorists to be cognisant of this fact, especially at set down and pick up times. By respecting the flashing amber lights, you are safeguarding the children's safety. The lights are programmed for the morning, infant collection time and home time.

School Garden:

Miss Melody's class has taken responsibility of the school garden. Mrs Carroll coordinated and developed the planting and relocation of herbs, fruits and vegetables for 2013. We also made a leaf composter and the class has been busy filling it with felled leaves this autumn. Hopefully Jack Frost won't be too severe on our potential bounty!

We are fortunate to have very talented, enthusiastic musicians in the school. Mrs. Kelly has established a school band to develop this in school. 
