## **BALLYMACARBRY CENTRAL SCHOOL – 2018**

January saw us move back to school following works necessitated by Storm Ophelia. Storm Emma followed quickly but afforded our pupils the chance to play in large snow. We waved goodbye to 25 pupils and welcomed 19 juniors. During the year we bade farewell to our esteemed colleague Anna and welcomed back Miss Melody, Miss Moore, Miss Mitchell and Mr. O'Cúirrín. Mr Early from Clerihan joined the staff. Brendan Reilly and Eleanor Muhlwald both left our BOM after serving 7 and 3 years respectively having given tremendous service. We welcome Breda Houlihan and Andrew Ryan on board.

Environment: We continue to promote Green policies in relation to litter reduction, water conservation and energy reduction. We are now in the process of acquiring our 5th Green Flag on Biodiversity and the Green School's Committee is working diligently to this end. We also liaise with the Tidy Towns on its annual application and engage in projects to try and have the school look its best. Congratulations to them on successes in 2018.

Religion: 2018 was a busy year sacramentally with 4 events taking place locally in May. Bishop Cullinan, confirmed our Fourmilewater candidates and their Nire counterparts on the same day. First Communion was administered by Fr. Kelleher and Fr. Desmond. Our religious inspection occurred in June when we held a farewell mass for Rang 6 and retirement mass for Anna. We welcomed our Grandparents in January as part of Catholic Schools' Week. We held a prayer service for the repose of the soul of the late Gerard Kiely, Curtiswood and Newcastlewest after Easter. As I write, Nire Communion has been scheduled for Sun 19th May and FMW one week later, Sun 26th May. We liaise well with both parishes in sacramental preparation and I thank both staff and parish volunteers for their assistance.

Sport: Our pupils excel both in and out of the classroom. We encourage our pupils to be active and find their preferred sports / pastimes. We thank all those who help in any way to encourage sport at our school; our staff, including Mrs Byrne, Mr O Cuirrín and Mrs Coffey, our local clubs, our coaches Barry Dunne, Eoin Wall and parents. We are traditionally very successful at this level, but it is the competing which is so important.

In 2018 we won the Girls West Football Competition but were unlucky in the County Final when bowing to Ballygunner NS by 2 pts. It was a very close match and could have gone either way. Our boys reached both Western A finals in 2018 but were narrowly defeated on both occasions. We did present our 2017 medals in June and our guest speaker on the night was local Gael Michael Ryan. We wish Michael well in future endeavours and congratulate him on his recent tenure as Lake county manager.

In May we swept the boards during the Athletic Club Race meet. We partake in swimming annually in Clonmel and have a designated Active Week each June. Weekly, we hear of our pupils excelling in team and individual sports. We congratulate them as we do, the Nire/FMW /Ballymacarbry Ladies and all other local clubs on their successes and wish them well for the coming year.

The Arts: The arts are catered for admirably at school. Numbers in our Banna Ceoil under Mrs Kelly & Niamh Fenton are very high, playing a range of musical instruments. They assist in times of sacraments as well as other functions. We were guests at the recent Nire Fair. Oidhreacht Fr. Bracken was again held in our school in July, where the music and songs of our former priest were played and learned. Clan Cluana staged Fionn Mac Cumhaill from Irish History and Mythology. As is tradition at our school, we would have staged our Annual Céilí prior to St Patrick's Day.
